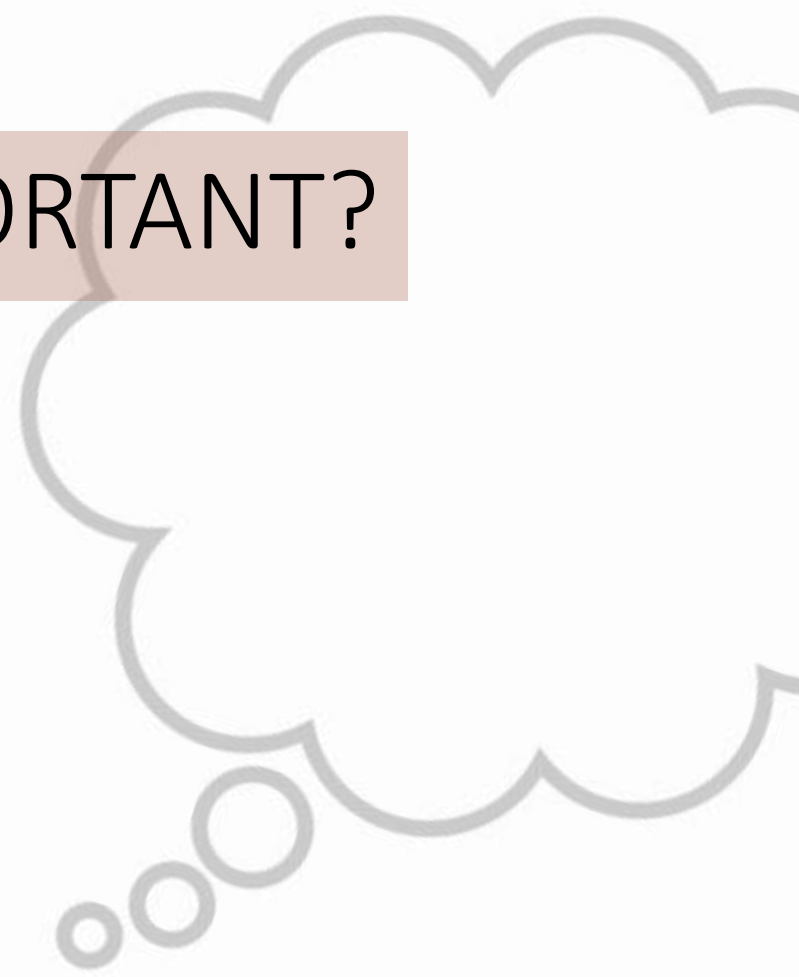

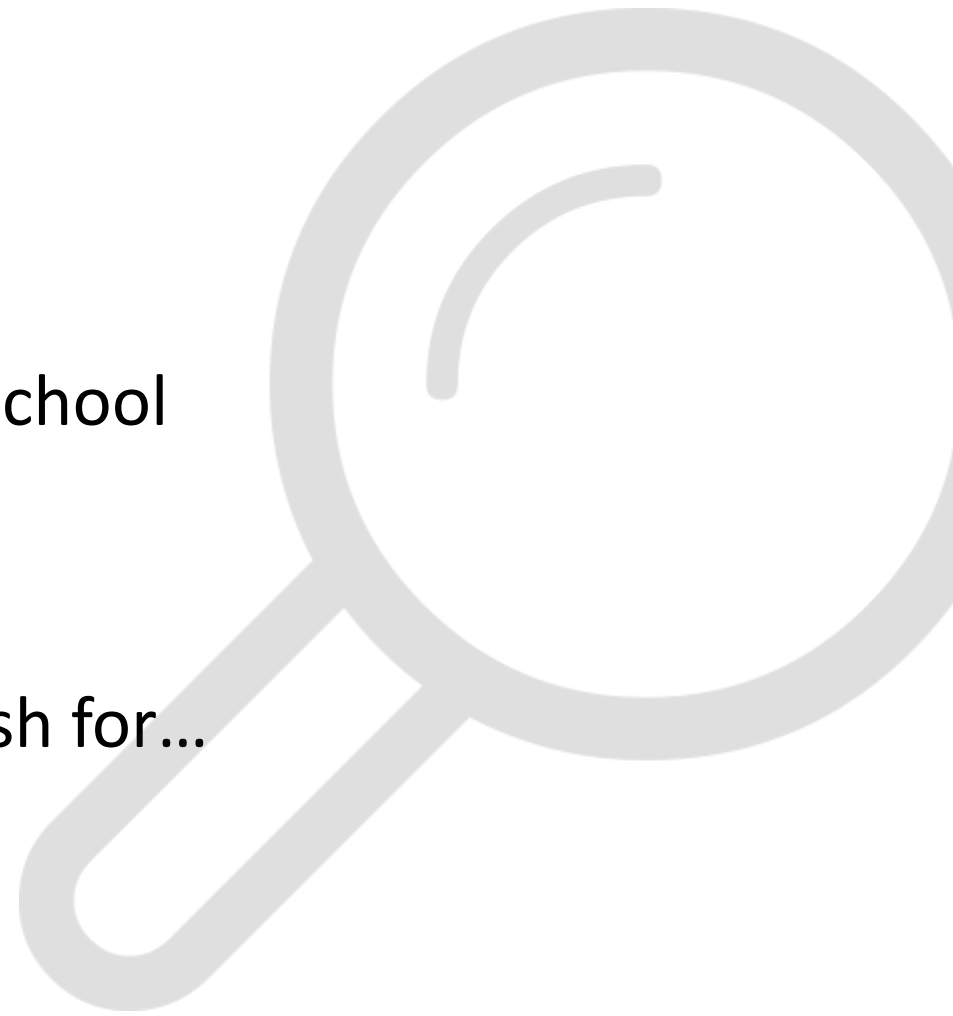
WHY IS COURSE SELECTION IMPORTANT?

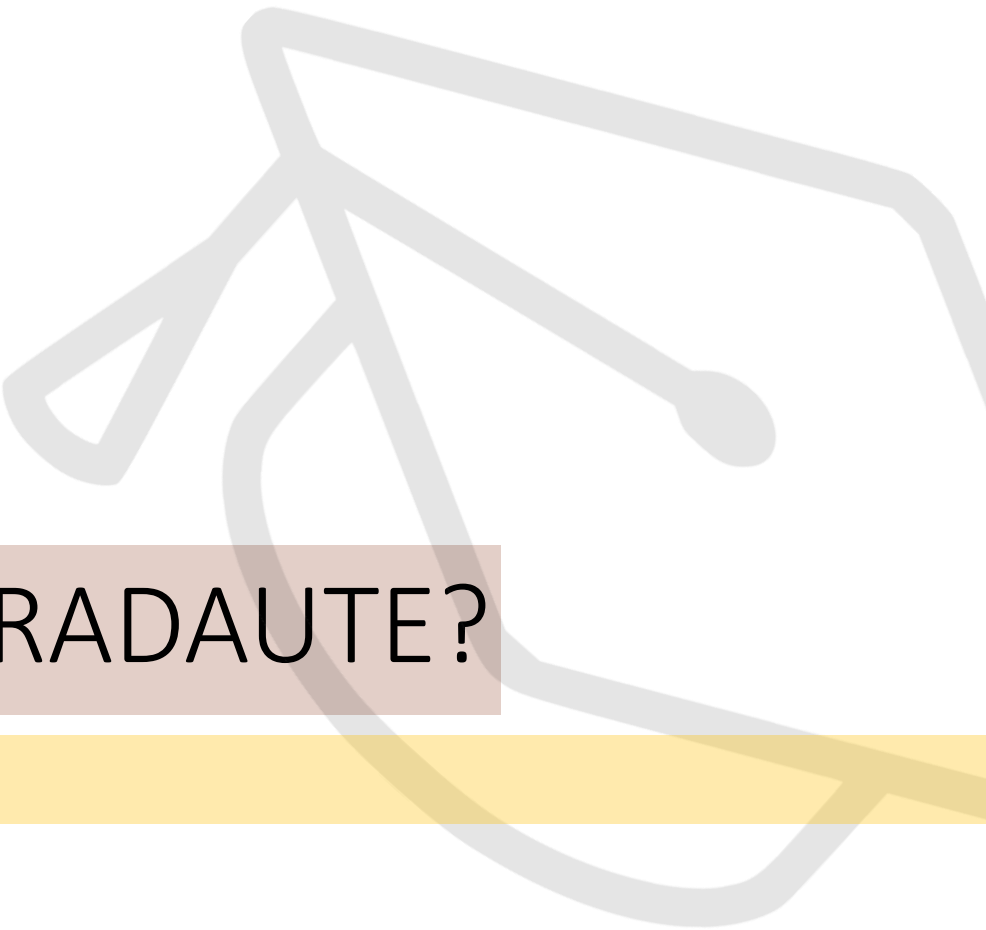
- Determines what courses can and will be offered
- Changes to timetables are difficult or impossible
- Supports your goals after graduation

- Credits are from Grade 10, 11 and 12

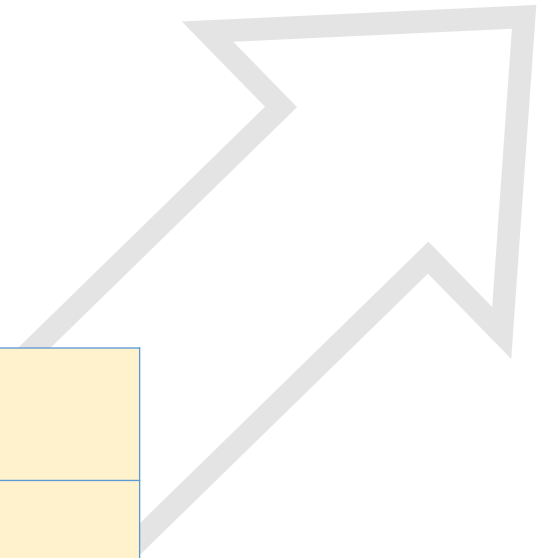

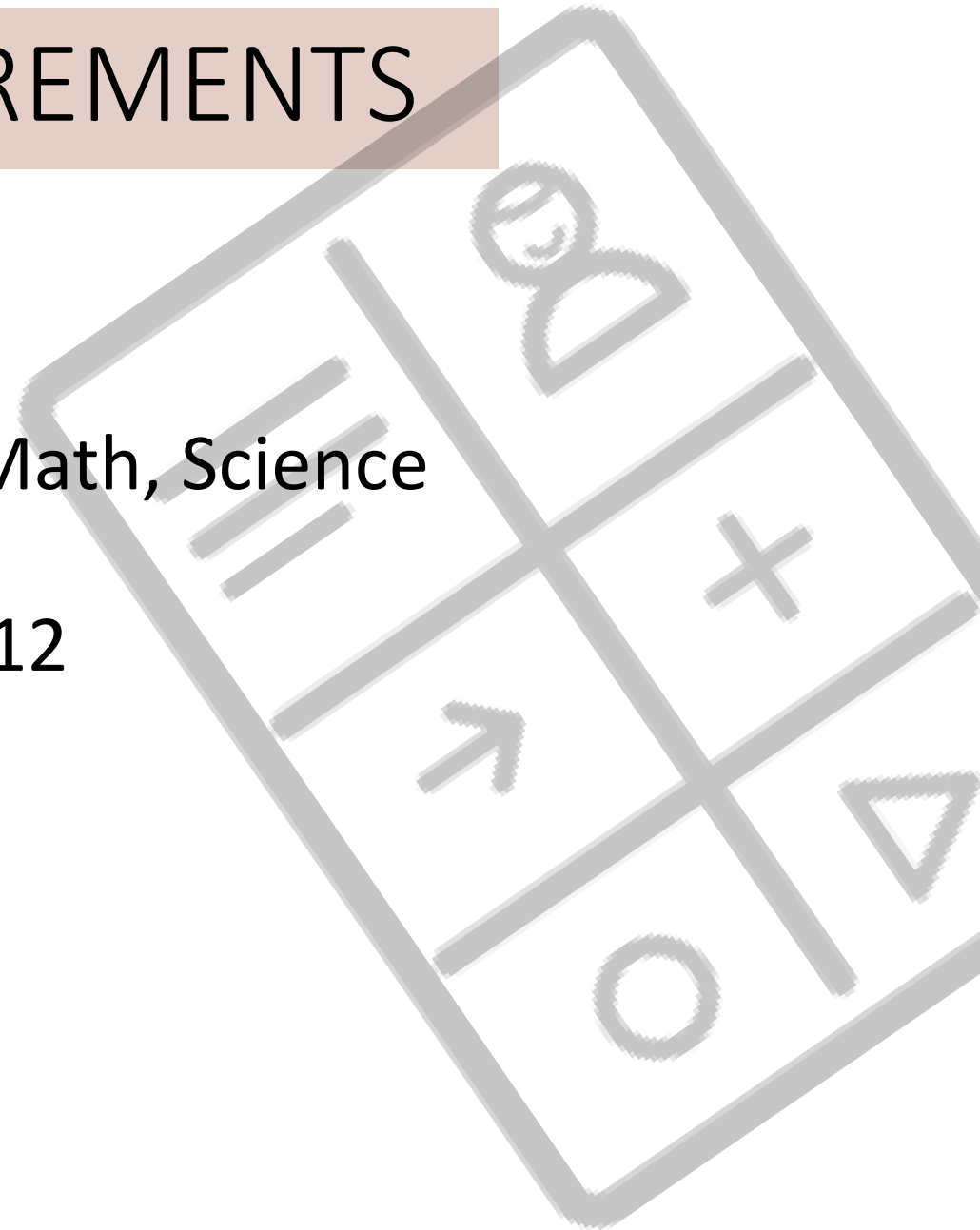
POST SECONDARY (PSI) OPTIONS

- Important to consider what you wish to pursue now
- Different requirements for programs at college/university, trades, etc.
- Blueprint



TYPICAL UNIVERSITY REQUIREMENTS

- English 12
- Program-specific requirements, such as Math, Science
- Variety of courses taken in grade 11 and 12
- Academics – Keep doors open!



UNIVERSITY ADMISSIONS

- 1) High school Graduation
- 2) Apply before the stated deadline
- 3) Personal Profile
- 4) GLA 12 Score (UBC Requires a 3)
- 5) English 12
- 6) 5+ additional academic courses (variable, but recommended)
 - Institution-specific (min grades in certain subjects)
 - Program specific (completion of specific 11 and 12 subjects eg. Faculty of Science or Engineering)
- 7) Competitive G.P.A. (AVERAGE) based on
 - English 12 and other required courses depending on program



COLLEGE ADMISSIONS

- 1) High school Graduation
- 2) English 12
- 3) Arts & Science and University Transfer may require specific Grade 11/12 subjects
- 4) Upgrading options available
- 5) Apply Early! First Come First Serve

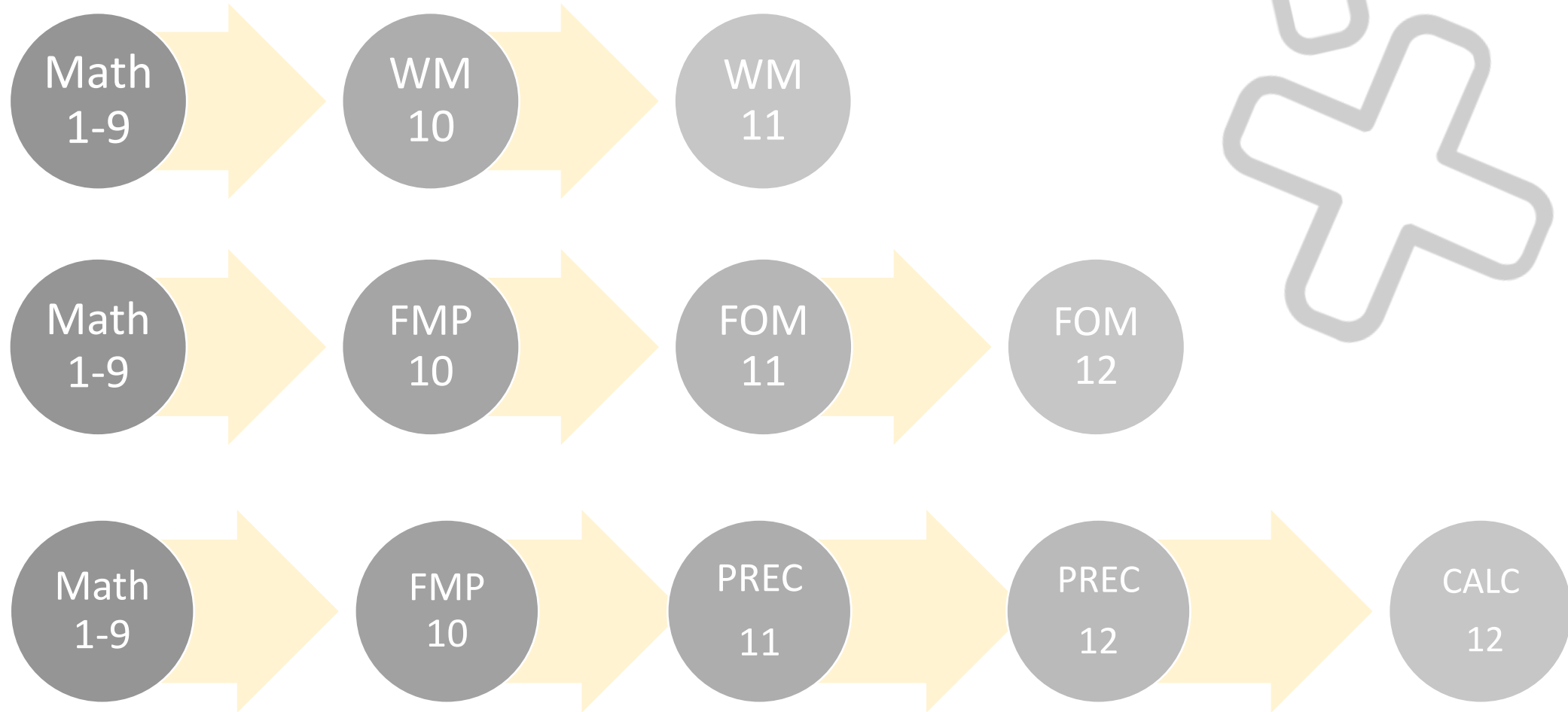

MATH REQUIREMENTS

- Need ONE Grade 11 Math to Graduate
- Think about your Future Goals
 - Some PSI Programs require Precalculus 12, or even Calculus 12 (Ontario, etc)
 - Some PSI Programs will accept Foundations 11 AND Foundations 12 OR Precal 11
- Very important to review requirements for PSI programs

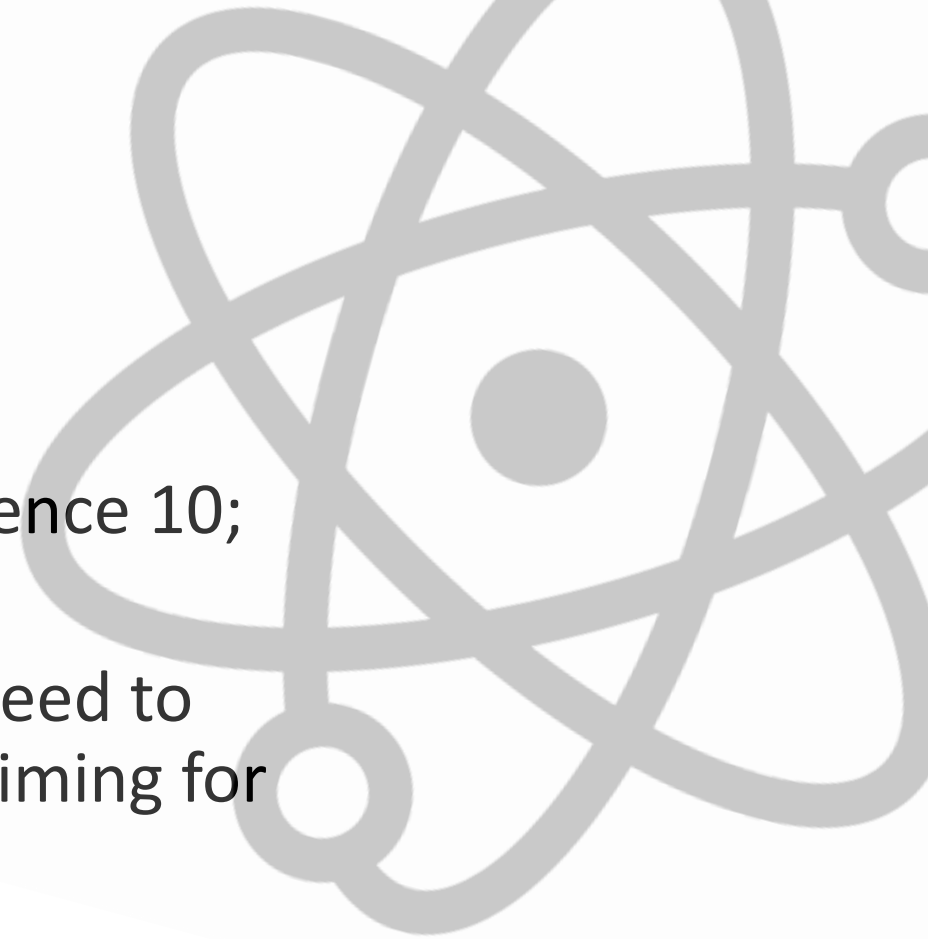

SCIENCE REQUIREMENTS

- Need ONE Grade 11/12 Science to Graduate
- Think about your success and struggles in Science 10; choose accordingly
- Think about your Future Goals (You do NOT need to take 3 Grade 11/ 12 Sciences, but if you are aiming for competitiveness, it does help)
- Very important to review requirements for PSI programs; they often REQUIRE specific sciences
- Think BEYOND the bare requirements for PSI

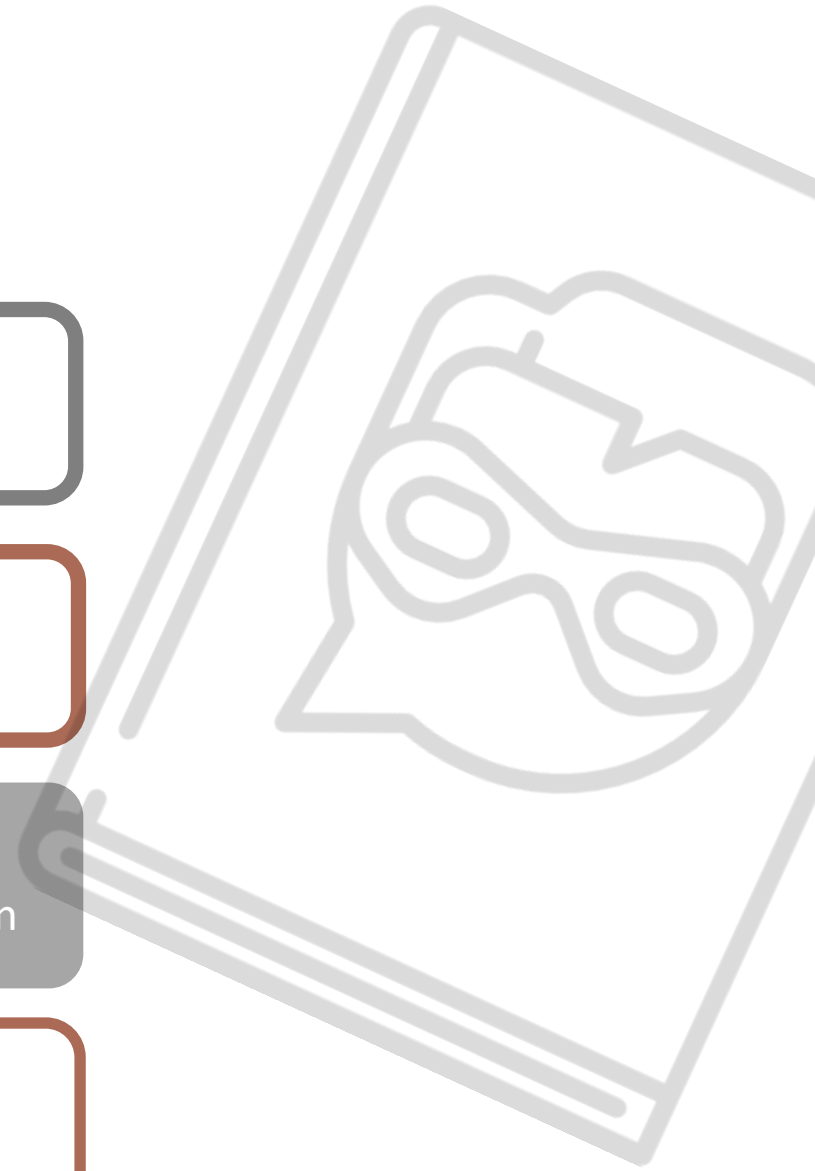

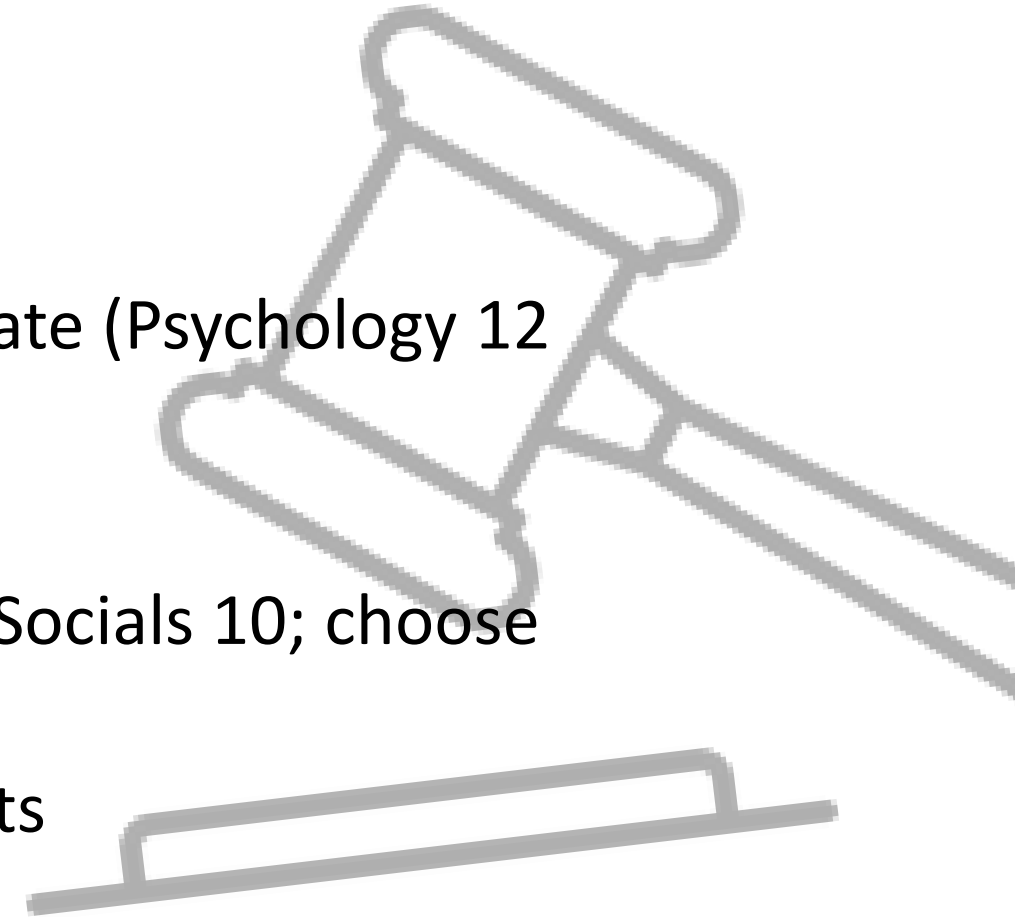

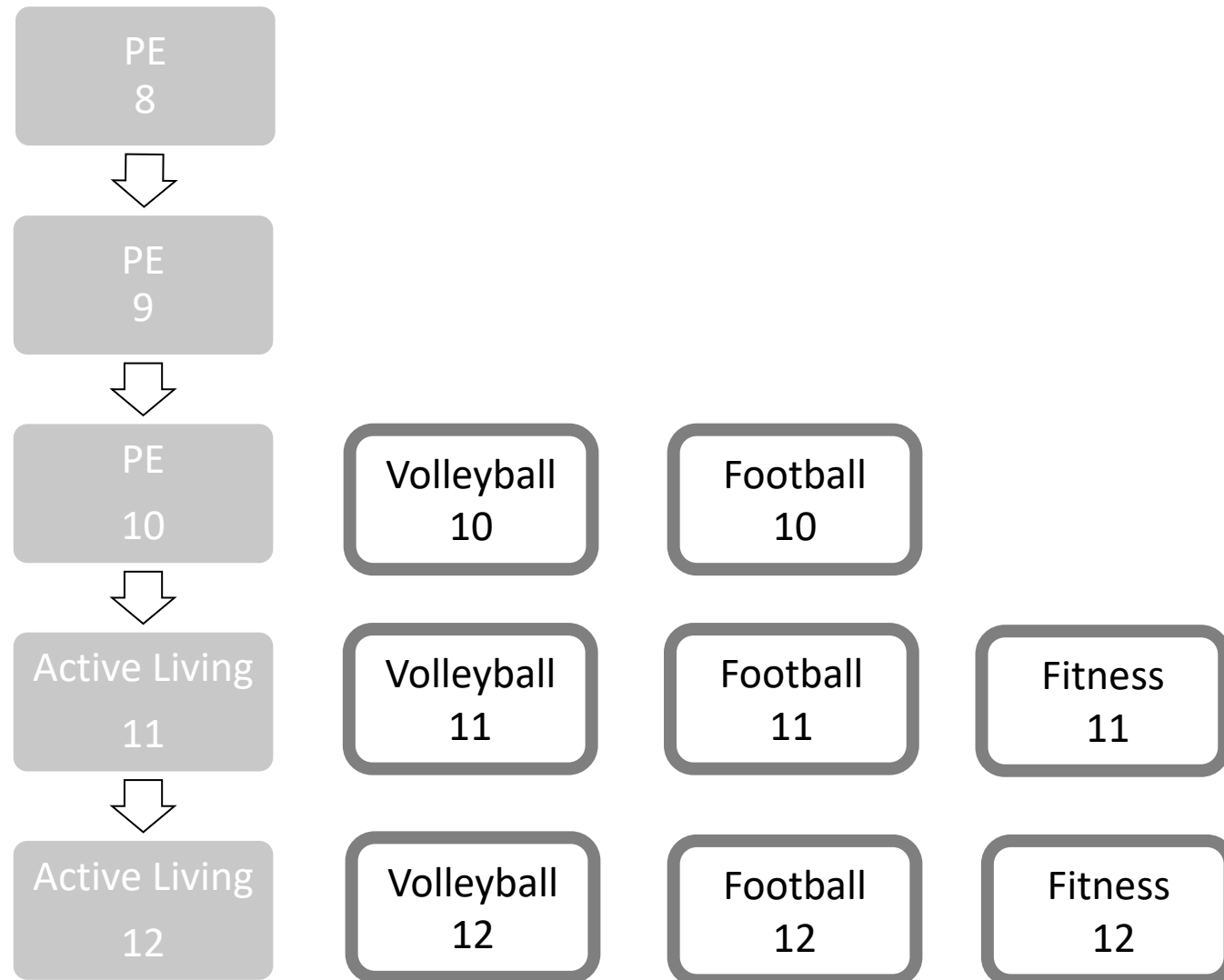


SOCIALS REQUIREMENTS

- Can select a 12 if entering 11
- Think about your success and struggles in Socials 10; choose accordingly
- Think about your Future Goals and interests

- Require PE 8-10 to graduate
- PE 11-12 are used as electives
- Think about your Future Goals and interests

 - Career Life Connections & Capstone Project 12

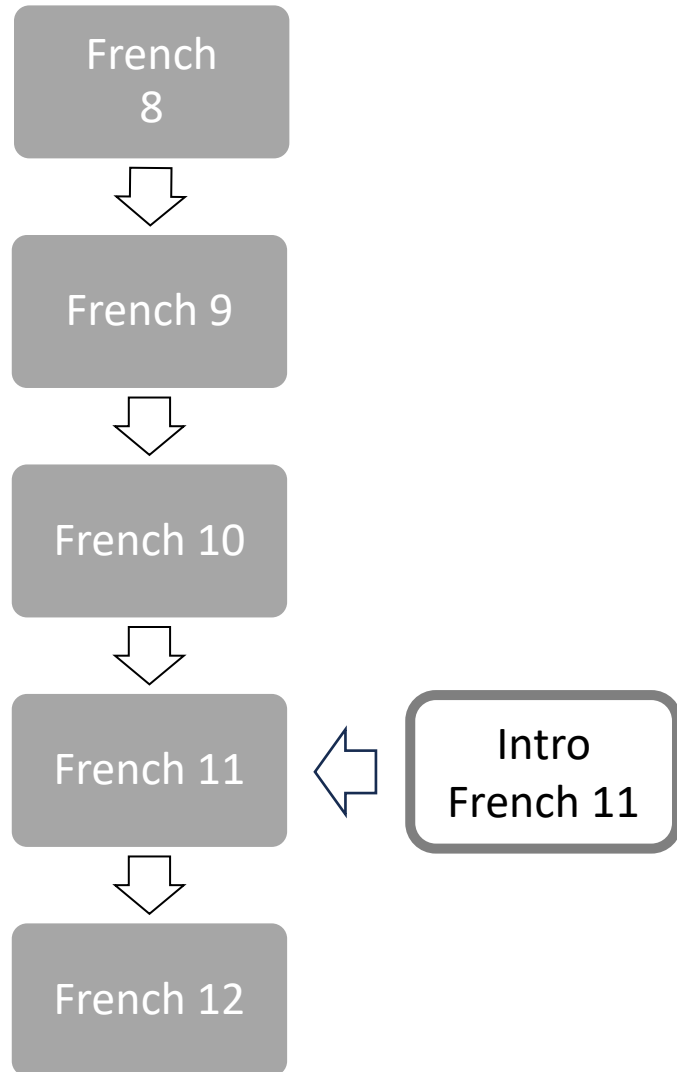

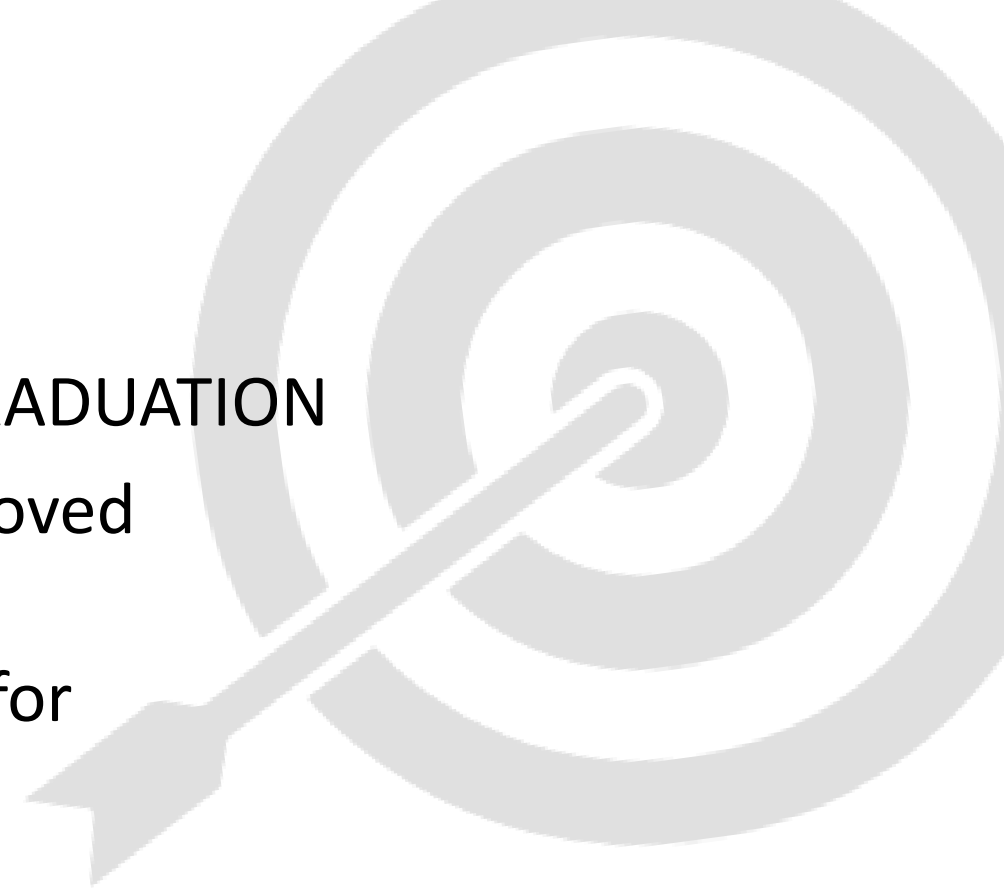

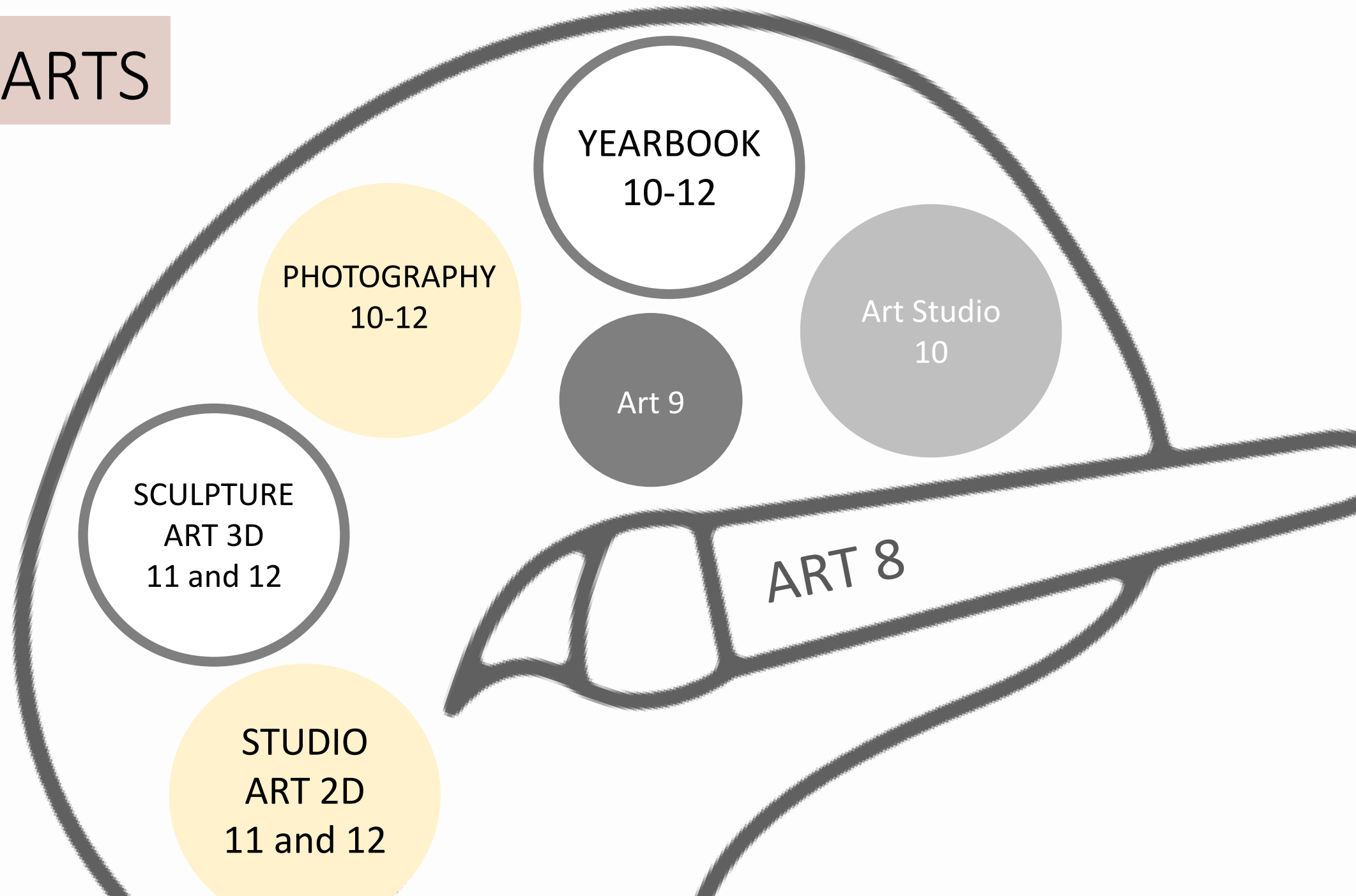


LANGUAGE REQUIREMENTS

- French 11 and/or 12 is no longer required for admission to PSI



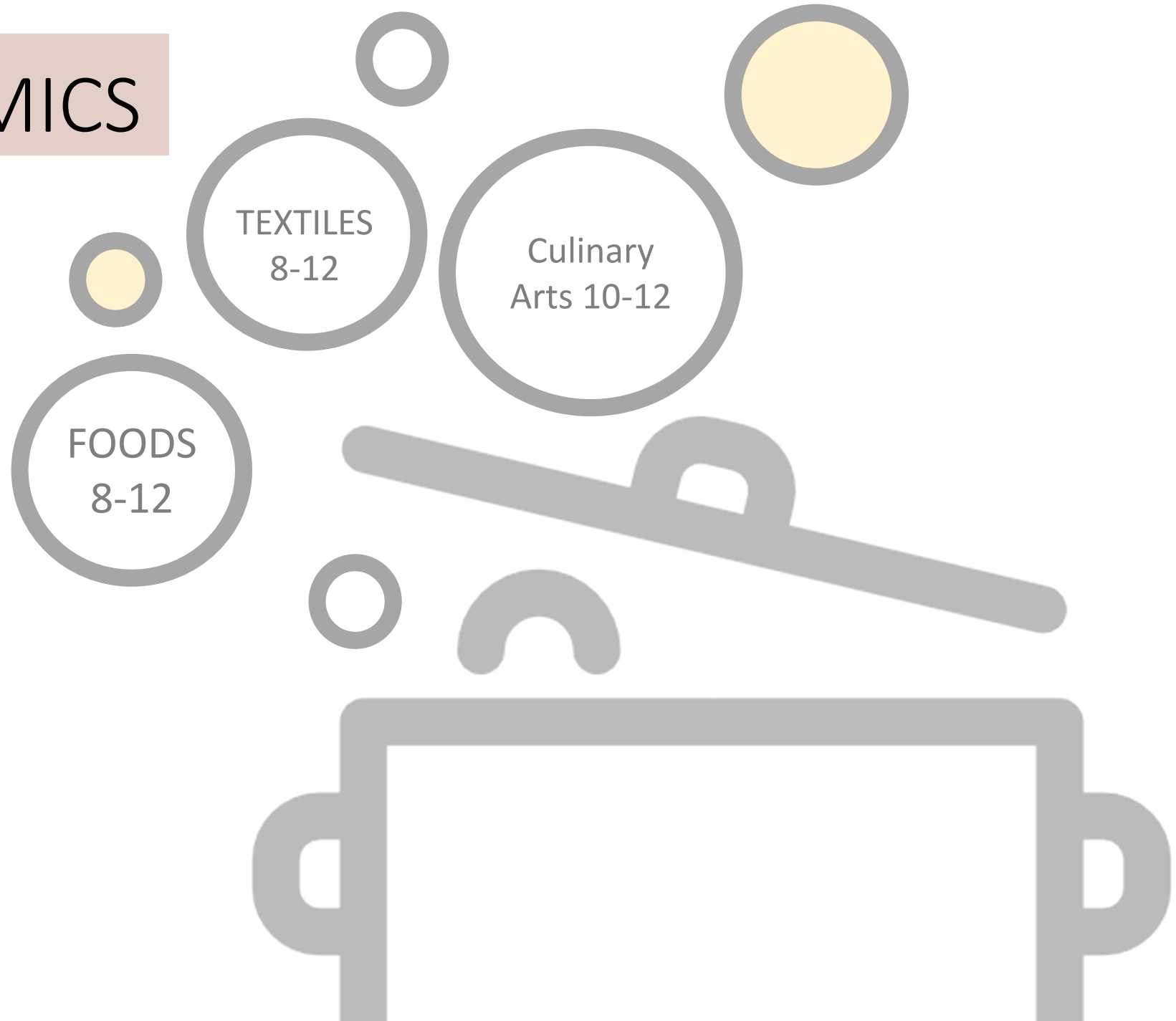

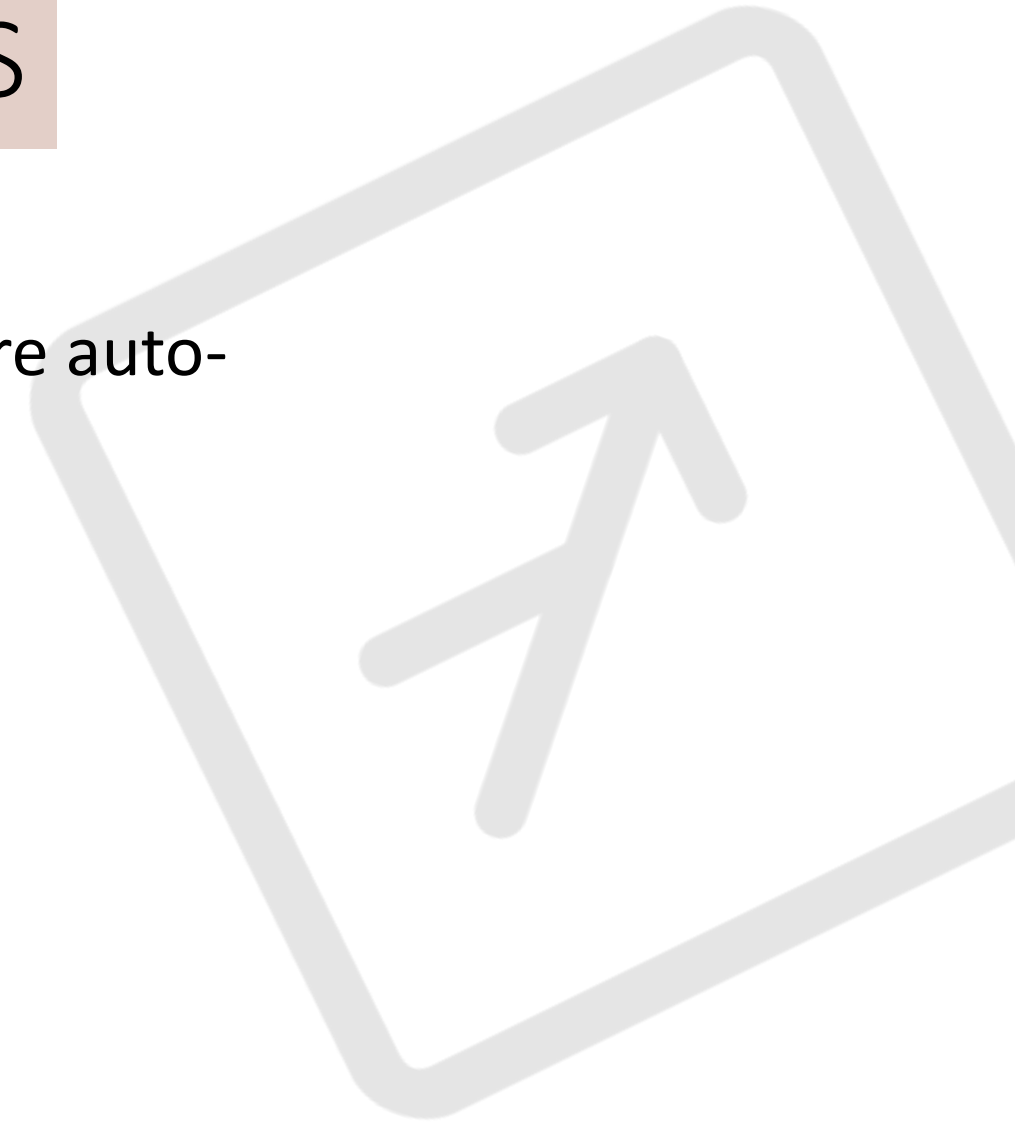


REMINDERS

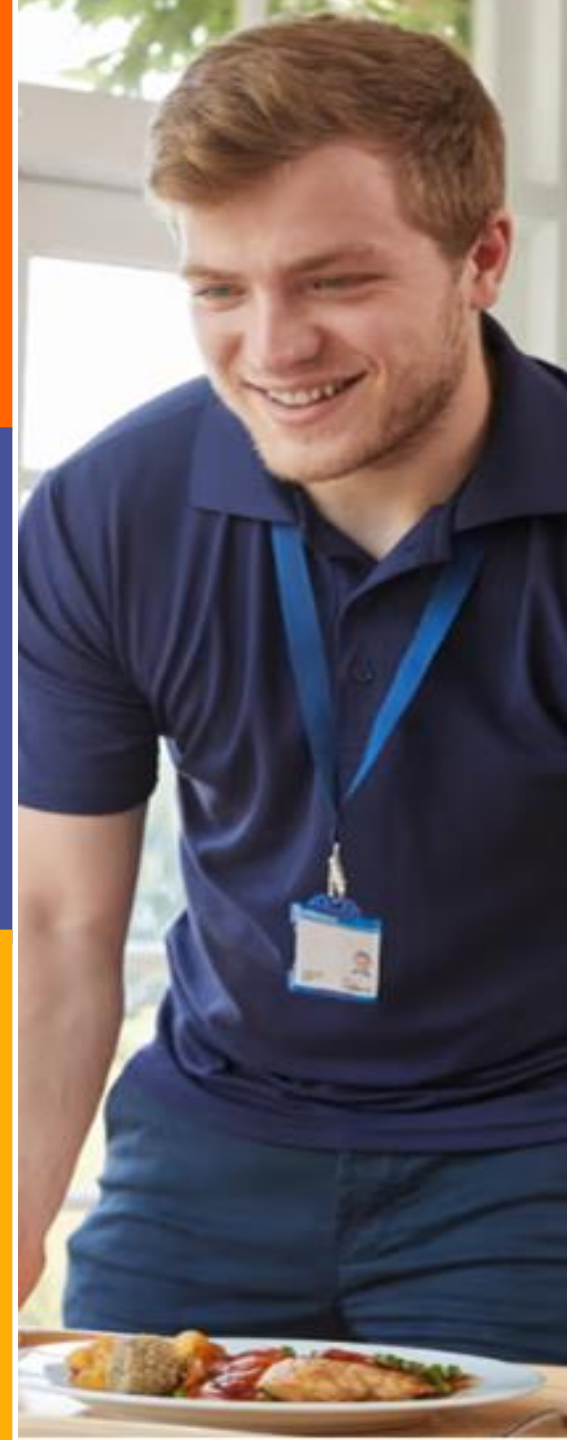

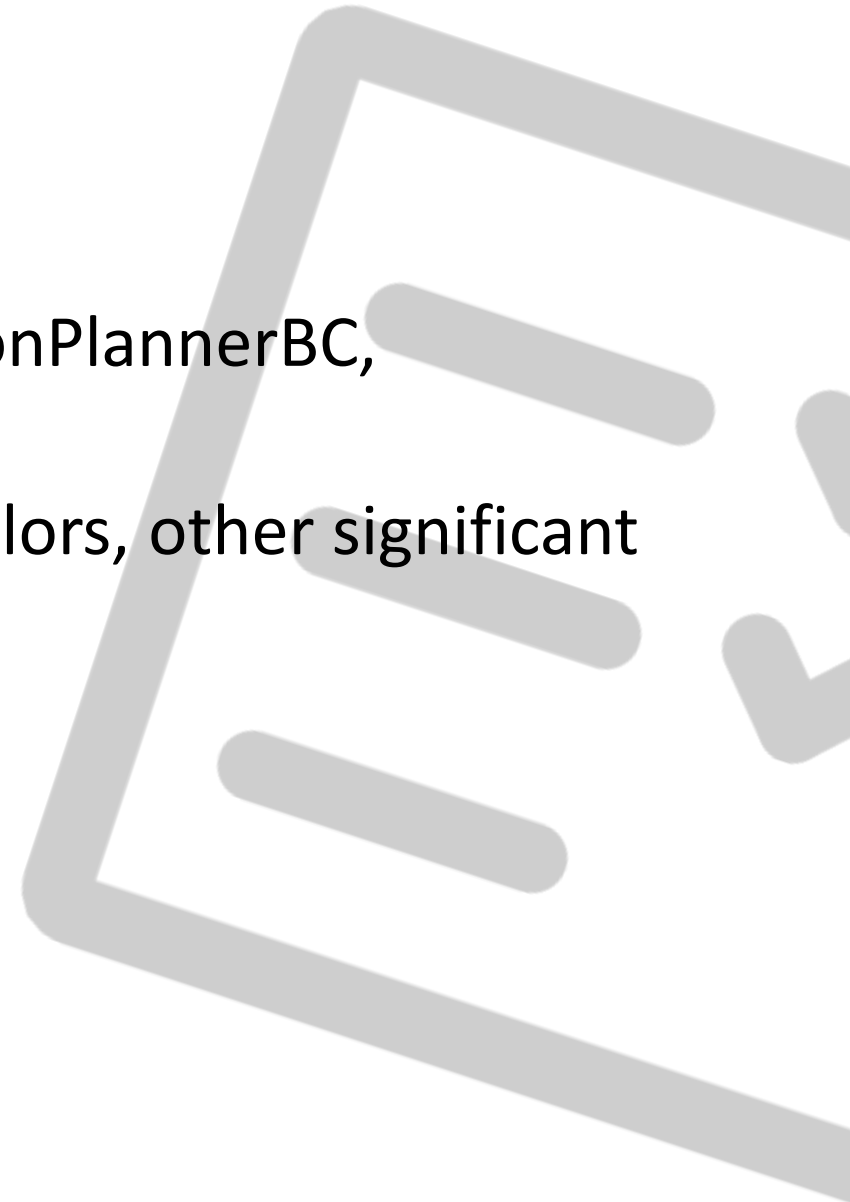

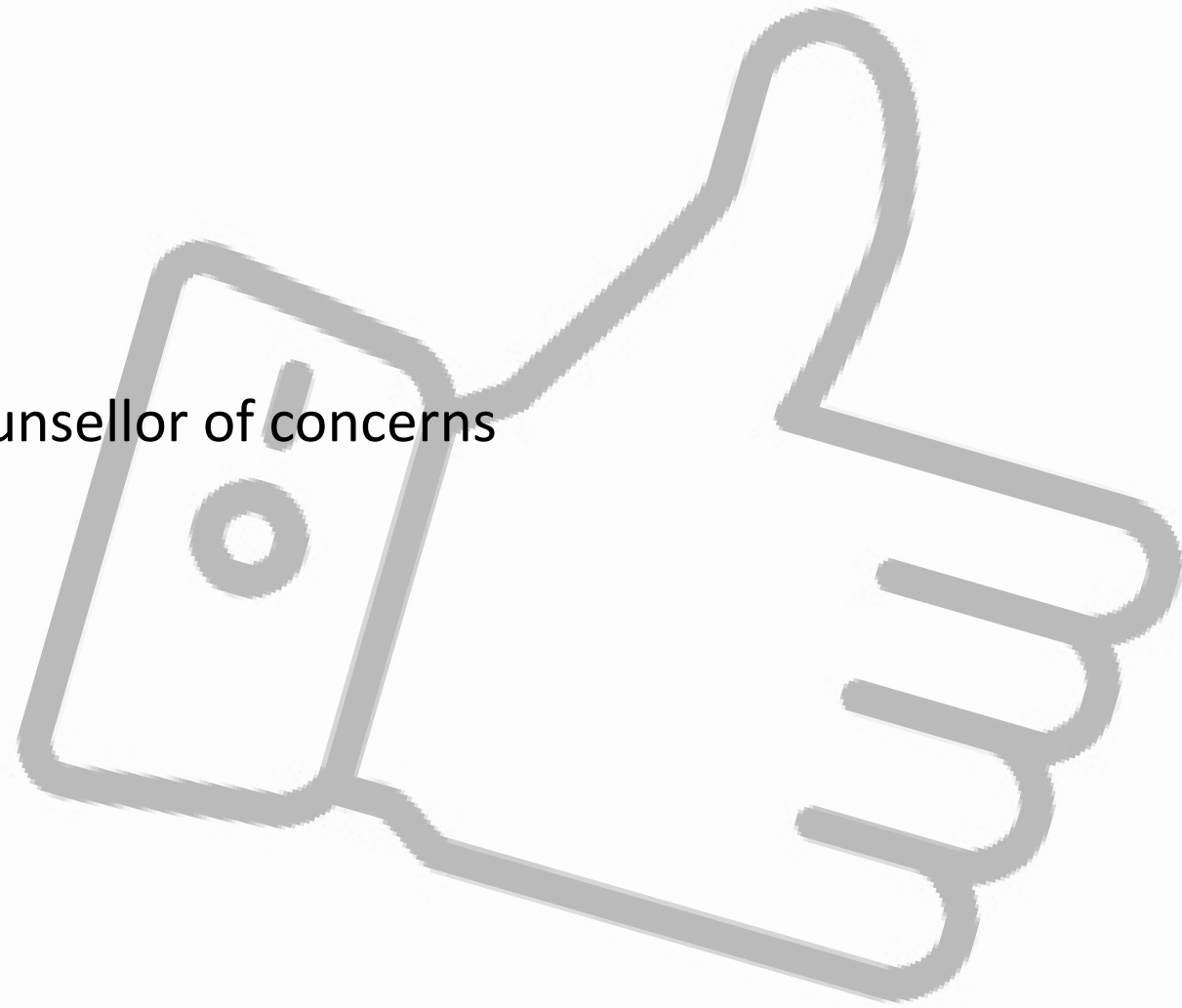
NEXT STEPS
